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### **Register your Acer product**

Go to www.acer.com/register-product, and sign in or sign up your Acer ID to register your product.

Once it is done, you can review it under "My Products" page.

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## **GETTING STARTED**

### Turn on your Chromebook

On the Chromebook, press the power button. A "Welcome" screen will appear when the Chromebook first boots up.

#### Select your language settings

Use the "Language" drop-down list to choose your default language setting. If there is more than one way to type in your language, you may be prompted to select a keyboard input method as well.

#### **Connect to a network**

Select a network from the "Connect to network" list to connect to the Internet. If network access is protected, you will need an access password to connect to it.

#### Accept the Terms of Service

Once connected to a network, accept the Terms of Service. Your Chromebook will then download any available system updates, so you automatically get the latest Chrome OS features.

## First-time sign-in

#### **Create a new Google Account**

You can create a new Google Account if you don't already have one. Select **Create a Google Account** to set up a new account. A Google Account gives you access to useful web services developed by Google, such as Gmail, Google Drive, and Google Calendar.

#### Browse as a guest

You can also use the Chromebook without a Google Account by selecting **Browse as a Guest**.

#### **Enterprise enrollment (optional)**

You can enroll the Chromebook by selecting Enterprise enrollment.

#### Sign in to your Google Account

If you already have a Google Account, enter your username and password in the sign-in box that appears and select the **Sign in** button. If your device is a Chromebook Enterprise, click **More options** and select **Enterprise enrollment**.



Sign in with your primary Google Account. This account will be set as the owner and is the only account that will be able to change certain Chrome settings.


# YOUR ACER CHROMEBOOK TOUR

## **Front view**

## **Keyboard view**

| 2 |      | Fingerprint reader (optional) | Fingerprint reader for unlocking your computer.   |
| 3 |      | Touchpad / click<br>button    | Touch-sensitive pointing device<br>which functions like a computer<br>mouse.<br>Pressing down anywhere on the pad<br>functions like the left button of a<br>mouse.<br>Pressing down anywhere with two<br>fingers functions like the right button<br>of a mouse. |

## **Function keys**

The Chromebook uses function keys or key combinations to access some hardware and software controls, such as screen brightness and volume. The dedicated function keys each have a specific function.

| lcon     | Function        | Description                        |
|----------|-----------------|------------------------------------|
| ←        | Previous        | Go to the previous page.           |
| C        | Reload          | Reload the current page.           |
| 23       | Full-screen     | Open the page in full-screen mode. |
|          | Next window     | Switch to the next window.         |
| 0        | Screenshot      | Takes screenshot.                  |
| 0        | Brightness down | Decreases the screen brightness.   |
| <b>¢</b> | Brightness up   | Increases the screen brightness.   |
| N)       | Mute            | Turns off audio output.            |
| •        | Volume down     | Decreases the volume.              |
| •        | Volume up       | Increases the volume.              |
|          | Lock screen     | Locks the screen.                  |
| ۲        | Launcher        | Launch the Apps panel.             |

#### **Common keyboard shortcuts**

You can use shortcuts to complete some tasks more quickly.

| Keyboard<br>shortcuts | Description           |
|-----------------------|-----------------------|
| Ctrl +                | Takes screenshot.     |
| Alt +                 | Toggles caps lock.    |
| Alt + <b>C</b>        | Projects your screen. |

#### Touchpad

The built-in touchpad is a pointing device that senses movement on its surface. This means the cursor responds as you move your fingers across the surface of the touchpad.

| Action                           | Gesture  |
|----------------------------------|--|
| Click                            | Press down on any part of the touchpad.  |
| Two-finger tap<br>(or alt-click) | Tapping the touchpad with two fingers or pressing (and holding) <b>Alt</b> on the keyboard and tapping the touchpad with one finger both equal a "right-click" on a computer mouse.          |
| Two-finger swipe                 | Place two fingers on the touchpad and move<br>them up and down to scroll vertically, left and right<br>to scroll horizontally.   |
| Drag and drop                    | Select the item you want to move with one finger.<br>With a second finger, move the item. Release<br>both fingers to drop the item. (This gesture works<br>for files, not windows or icons.) |



#### **USB Type-C information**





| Where can I find my files?  | All your files are stored in the Files app 🖸.<br>Find the app by clicking the Launcher icon 🔘<br>and searching "Files".  |
| How do I transfer my local files?                                   | Transfer your local files using a compatible<br>storage device. Your Chromebook works with<br>most external storage devices (e.g.: USB<br>thumb drives, removable hard drives).  |
| Why does my<br>Chromebook need<br>my Google Account<br>information? | You'll use your Google Account to sign in to<br>your Chromebook. It is the same account you<br>use for Google services such as Gmail and<br>Drive. Your Chromebook uses your account<br>information to automatically sign you into apps<br>and services.   |

| How do I set this up for my child? | If you want to set up parental controls for your<br>child, it's important that you sign in using your<br>child's personal Google Account. If they don't<br>already have one, you can create one during<br>the sign-in process on your Chromebook. You<br>will be able to add your child's school account<br>after you complete device onboarding. |
